

The BOT meets twice termly at 7.00pm in the school staffroom. Parents are invited to attend these open meetings.

The main function of the Trustees is to be responsible for all governance aspects of the school, which include staff appointments, financial matters and budgeting, building maintenance, equipment, grounds, furniture and amenities. Other duties include welfare of students and staff, as well as strategic planning and reporting. Boards of trustees are elected every three years and are able to co-opt additional members.

Parkvale Parent Teacher Association - PTA

Parkvale School has an active Parent Teacher Association (PTA) which meets monthly. Parents are welcome to attend these meetings in the staff room. The PTA has two main functions: first to actively provide opportunities to bring parents and teachers to a closer relationship through co-operation and understanding, and second to raise funds to provide extra educational facilities. Your support is important and necessary. Parents are encouraged to feel welcome to volunteer their interests in whatever field . We are always needing some extra parent helpers so if you are keen, please come along and join our friendly, fun filled meetings. Assembly

A cordial invitation is extended to all families to attend our fortnightly school assembly held in the school hall. They are on even weeks @ 9am Friday mornings.



Regularly during the year children are given order forms for Scholastic Book Clubs. If parents wish to purchase any of these, they can do so online or by completing the form on the pamphlet and placing it together with the correct money into an envelope and returning to the class teacher by the specified date. Parents are under no obligation to purchase books.

Break Times / Brainfood

At Parkvale School we run two 30min breaks throughout the day. The first of these breaks is split so that the Year 0-3 children's break is separate from the Year 4-6 children's break. Our second break is as a whole school together. We believe healthy food choices enhance educational outcomes. Research has proven this to be so, with good food choices leading to improvements in memory, concentration and behaviour. Parent's awareness and support of these healthy options is also leading to more informed choices being made for children's morning tea's and lunches. Foods appropriate for breaks include; Raw fruit & vegetables, nuts & natural popcorn, crackers, sandwiches/wraps.

Breakfast Club

We operate a breakfast club at school from 8.15am-8.45am for any children who wish to have breakfast at school or a top up of breakfast. Some of our children do not eat at home when they first get up or have eaten breakfast early and are hungry again by the time they get to school. Our breakfast club is free to anyone wishing to use it and is sponsored by Sanitarium, Anchor, and generous donations from our community.

Cycling / Scooters

It is the parent's responsibility entirely if they wish their child to ride to and from school. The police do not feel that children under the age of 9 years have sufficient control over a bicycle to be able to ride it on the road safely. Bikes need to be locked when at school and helmets must be worn. Scooters can be stored in the scooter racks. These are locked during the day. We ask that children walk their bikes on the footpath down Howard Street due to traffic congestion. Once inside school grounds, bikes and scooters must be walked not ridden.

Clothing / Personal Belongings

Students are encouraged to be responsible for and take care of their personal belongings and clothing/uniform. All items are REQUIRED to be NAMED. Expensive items such as toys, tablets, phones etc should be left at home, as the school cannot be responsible for any damage or loss of such items. Any lost property will be found in the lost property room at the end of Room 22, or by seeing Sherryl in the school office.

Charter

A copy of our School Charter and school policies are available for perusal from the school office, as well as Board of Trustee meeting minutes, reports and financial statements from the monthly BOT meetings. The Charter is reviewed regularly.

Communication

Communication between school and home is vital for keeping whanau up-to-date with school events and information. Please check the school website (www.sportsground.co.nz/parkvale) Facebook page, class SeeSaw App and Skool Loop App to receive the latest information.

Composite Classes

Due to the number of pupils at each year group, we at times need to form composite classrooms (mixed years). The programmes in each classroom are designed to cater for individual needs of children.

Custody / Guardianship or Non-Molestation Orders

If there are issues or specific conditions associated with access to your child, it is important we are informed. Parents with 'custody' or 'non-molestation' orders should contact the Principal or the Pastoral Care Worker, so the school and teachers affected are aware of the conditions.

Complaints / Concerns

If you have any concerns about something happening at the school, we ask that you make an appointment with the class teacher and discuss the issue. If the matter is unresolved or has resurfaced, we would ask that you then make an appointment with a Deputy Principal or the Principal. If the matter is still unresolved, we would ask that you put the concern in writing addressed to the Chairperson of the Board of Trustees.

Contact Details

It is important for the benefit of the child that the parents / caregivers are responsible for informing us of any changes in family situations, eg change of address, telephone / mobile numbers, emergency contact numbers. These can be vital in times of emergency and/or seeking help for your child.

Class Transfers

We try to keep the movement of children to other classes during the year to a minimum. Any movement between classes is usually a result of high numbers entering the junior classes. This cannot always be predicted due to new children enrolling at our great school.

Smergency / Evacuation Drill

In the event of a natural disaster or Civil Defence Emergency the school will enact our Disaster Plan. During such an event, it is essential that all students can be accounted for at all times. Should parents arrive to collect their child(ren) they **must** advise the class teacher or Principal. Drills for emergency evacuation of classrooms are practised once per term. In case of a major disaster **ALL** children are held at school for their safety, until collected by parents or guardians. Part of our enrolment form will ask for details of an alternate contact/pick up person in the event of an emergency.

Cield Trips

Teachers are encouraged to take their classes on educational field trips. These may range from short walking excursions around the school, to transported visits to local points of learning interest, and overnight camping. All school/class trips must have adequate adult to student ratios. For some activities more adults will be required. The teachers arranging trips or camps will have them approved by the Principal, and be responsible for informing parents of costs, programme etc, and seeking parents' assistance.

Buses are used often for transport. If private cars are to be used it is a requirement that seatbelts are available for all passengers and that drivers do not smoke while transporting children in their vehicle. All drivers must have a current drivers licence and all vehicles must be certified. Evidence of these will be sighted by teachers. For overnight camps all parents attending will be police vetted by the school.

Realth / Medication

Please complete all the necessary health forms included in this enrolment pack. These give us the knowledge to care for your child appropriately at school. Parents are encouraged to notify the school of any changes to the health status of their child. If medication is to be administered by staff, parents are required to complete a medical form at the school office.

Ilness & Accident

If a child becomes ill at school, parents are contacted and suitable arrangements are made. If both parents are working, the name and telephone number of someone who can be called in an emergency should be known. This is particularly necessary in the case of accidents. Where contact cannot be made, the school will take the action a prudent parent would in an emergency, by contacting the family doctor or hospital.

ewellery

Except for wrist watches and ear studs jewellery should not be worn at school. This is a safety issue due to the daily activities children are involved in. We take no responsibility for loss of items.

ibrary Books

We have a well-resourced school library. When a school library book is brought home, we ask you to ensure your child handles it with care. If a book is lost or damaged, we expect the family to pay for the replacement.

Lunches / Moosies & Juicies

Lunches can be ordered through our school office on Tuesday and Thursday mornings. Order forms and money bags are at the office. Cash is essential. Orders are placed in the lunch order box.

Moosies and Juices are also ordered from the office. Order forms are available from the front desk and orders are placed in the Moosies order box with correct money attached.

Orders will be received by the child at their classroom prior to the lunch bell ringing.

usic Tuition

Private music tuition may be available at school during school hours depending on availability of tutors. Information is available at the office.

ewsletters

School newsletters will be issued every second Friday via Seesaw, email and Facebook. A paper copy is kept in the school office.

Written Reports

Reports are issued at mid-year and end of year for all students with a focus on learning qualities and behaviours, personal achievements, self reflection and academic progress.

Road Safety

Year 6 students at Parkvale are trained by the police to become Road Patrollers. There are crossings on Windsor Avenue between 8.10-8.40am and Howard Street between 8.15-8.45am and 2.45-3.00pm. There needs to be adult supervision at every crossing every day. If you are able to supervise one morning or afternoon a week, please let the school office know.



We ask that children arrive after 8.15am—this is the time when patrol monitors are on duty at the crossings that serve our school and students are permitted in the gate.

School Fees / Donation

There are no school fees/donations at Parkvale school as we are part of the Government funded School Fees scheme.



Stationery

Stationery lists are made available late Term 4 and when starting school for the first time. All school stationery is sold through an online portal and or our school office and are pre-packed for each year group. These are at very competitive prices. Eftpos is available.

Sports

Parkvale School believes in creating opportunities for children to be involved in extra curricula sporting activities. Opportunities are available for children of all ages throughout the year. Our dedicated teachers coach and support the various sporting activities. Children in Year 4,5 & 6 are involved in interschool fixtures while the junior children are encouraged to develop their skills by the in-school run programmes. We are always on the look out for parents/whanau to coach and manage to support teams.

Sports Uniform

These are issued through the office. We ask parents to encourage children to wear them for sport only. The wearing of our sports uniform identifies our pupils and promotes the positive nature of the school in the wider community. Some uniforms are issued for a season and some for the duration of an event.

Swimming

Swimming instruction and water safety are part of the school curriculum and all children are expected to take part unless there is a medical reason. If a child is unable to swim because of a medical reason please notify the classroom teacher. Swimming commences on the second day of school opening and continues for the first six weeks of term 1 and after labour Weekend in term 4 (weather permitting). As part of Sun Smart Awareness we encourage the wearing of a rash shirt.

Sunhats / Sunscreen

The school has a compulsory hat policy. All children must wear our school hat whilst at school during Terms 1 & 4. Hats are available for purchase from the school office. Children without hats will be directed to a shade area during breaks. We encourage all children to have sunscreen on prior to arriving to school during Terms 1 & 4 and carry it when on an out of school excursion.

Parkvale School Direct Credit / AP Details

At Parkvale School we run student accounts, they are maintained on our student management system and statements are sent out once a term, or on request.

We have found that it makes school expenses easier to deal with when an automatic payment or direct credit is set up for your child/rens schooling. This can be paid in whatever amount and format works for you eg weekly, fortnightly etc.
